TOYLAND is the name chosen for the dance, for which the com-mitteemen are taking a good nat-ured ribbing from the seniors.

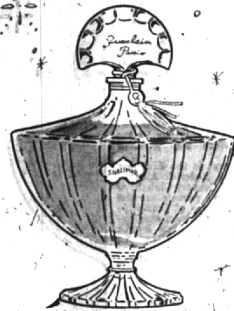
