Broomfield Speaks To Club Members

WALNUT LAKE—Members and guests of the Walnut Lake Men's club heard Congressman William S. Broomfield (R. Mich.) speak Monday evening in the clubrooms in West Bloomfield township.

In a typical cracker-barrel question and answer session following a showing of a motion picture, "Headquarters, USA," Broomfield explained that America's position in the current missile controversy was not one of complete defeat and indicated that despite apparently sensational revelations, the United States is well along the road to space conquest.

However, the Michigan representative pointed out that our educational institutions must prepare and encourage more high school students to enter the scientific field if this country is to continue in a position of world leadership.

Auto Crash Takes Life of Detroit Man

SOUTHFIELD—Donald Beardley, 57, of 2086 Lexington, Detroit was killed Saturday when his car ran out of control while he was driving on Telegraph near 10 Mile and struck an oncoming auto.

The occupants of the oncoming car, Harold Daraskovich, 18, 28315 Tyler, Birmingham, and Sharon Karzen, 14, 20945 Semple, Detroit, suffered minor injuries.

Southfield police said Beardley was traveling south on Telegraph when he apparently lost control of his car and it veered into the northbound lane striking the Daraskovich auto.

Discuss Future of Pensions

SOUTHFIELD—A delegation from the police and fire departments appeared before the Dec. 11 meeting of the City of Southfield charter commission to discuss the future of their pensions.

After listening to the delegation's plea, the commission turned the matter over to its attorney and got an opinion on the matter from the state attorney general.

IF THE present township becomes a city, the new city cannot assume a pension responsibility for township employees. As it now stands the employees would have their share of money in the township's share would be placed in the general fund as an asset.

The employees are asking that the new city assume the township's pension obligations and also that their seniority rights be continued when incorporation occurs.

In other action, the commissioners discussed a plan to exclude persons from running for city office who draw salaries from the federal or state government. The matter was set aside for further study.

A PORTION of the charter dealing with the election of the future city's mayor, clerk and treasurer also was passed. All of these officials shall be elected for two year terms.

The charter for the proposed 26-square-mile city was to have been ready for delivery to the governor's office this week but it will not meet the deadline.

Bloomfield Man Hurt in Auto Crash

BLOOMFIELD—John H. Duncan, 31, 4000 Quanton, Bloomfield township, was reported in good condition this week after being injured in an accident at Telegraph and Quanton roads last Friday.

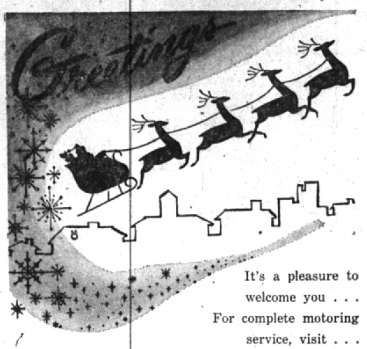
Group to Serenade FRANKLIN
