Board to Install Crossing Light

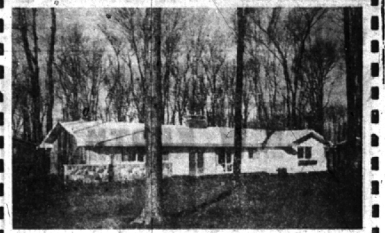
