The following resolution was offered by Commissioner Gray and supported by Commissioner Ford:

RESOLVED, that the following special assessment roll for the Derby Road improvement, to wit:

Roll No.	District	Portion (Assessable Lands)	City Portion (Non-Assessable Lands)	Other	Total
23		\$4,476.19	\$16,523.81		\$21,000.00

be and they are hereby severally confirmed; that the amount of the assessment against each parcel of assessable lands shall be divided into 5 installments, the first of which shall become due on 1st day of March, 1958, and the remaining installments shall become due in consecutive order, one each year, on the 1st day of March, beginning with the year 1959; that all installments from time to time unpaid shall on and after thirty (30) days from date hereof bear interest at the rate of six (6) per cent per annum payable annually on the respective due dates of installments Nos. 2 and subsequent, provided, however, that the whole assessment may be paid to the City Treasurer at any time in full with accrued interest thereon; and that the amounts to be paid by the City shall be paid as the construction work progresses.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the Commission hereby directs the assessments so made in the said special assessment rolls to be collected directly therefrom and that the Clerk shall attach his endorsement to each special assessment roll as provided in Ordinance No. 6, as amended.
