An open house will follow the service of dedication until 5:30 p.m.

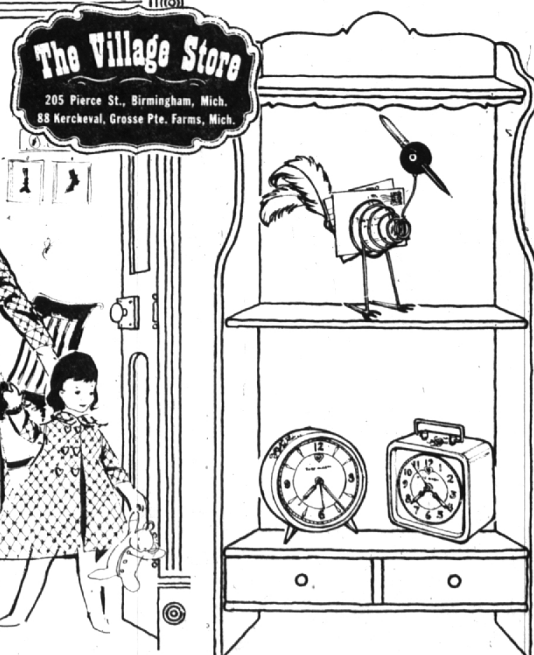
