

## 7 Problems Resolved by Troy, B'ham

It required 3 1/2 hours last Thursday night, but it resulted in agreement by Birmingham and Troy city officials on seven mutual problems. An eighth was held for further study.

Birmingham commissioners and Troy councilmen meeting here in special conference, agreed:

1. That water and sewer would be provided by private agreement between Birmingham and owner of a small area east of Adams at the end of Abbey road.
2. On terms of sale to Troy of 2025-foot-of water main and water from the Walker well.
3. Birmingham's immediate connection of Kuhlman Electric Co. to E. Maple to the Walker water supply.

4. TO HASTEN the paving of Derby road between Adams and the railroad.

5. That Troy will investigate the possibility of widening its share in the Troy triangle between Adams and the railroad was to the mutual benefit of both municipalities.

6. That proposed zoning of land in the Troy triangle between Adams and the railroad was to the mutual benefit of both municipalities.

7. That zoning of many Troy lots north of Maple and east of Coolidge would be best as single families, but would be no lower than multiple family.

8. TO AWAIT a vote on annexation of a small E. Maple industrial lot to Birmingham.

Water and sewer service to the Meyerck property on Adams at Abbey will permit construction of 32 multiple family units. Double rates will be charged, and formal South Oakland county water authority approval is expected for the connections.

By terms of the contract, Troy will pay \$13,500 for the water main over the next five years, and purchase an equal minimum of 3 million cubic feet of water from the Walker well at a rate of 10 cents per 1,000 cubic feet.

SALE OF the main will permit Kuhlman Electric's water service connection to be made very soon. It was pointed out.

Troy Mayor Frank Costello said regarding paving of Derby, "I think we can take care of this. Long a problem street of deep holes, heavy traffic has chewed it up regardless of constant maintenance by Troy.

While Derby paving costs would be recovered from abutting properties, Troy officials were not so certain of this ability right now to assume costs of widening Adams north from Madison.

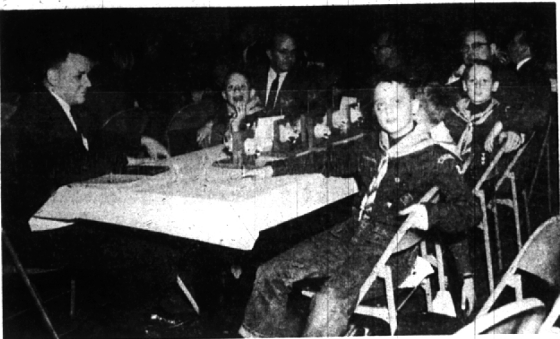
BIRMINGHAM already has widened it to that point, can go no further without Troy's participation, Troy said it would see what can be accomplished.

Birmingham officials learned Troy's proposed zoning ordinance, now undergoing hearings, would place single family zoning on lots between Coolidge and Birmingham's Walker well site.

OFFICIALS of both cities agreed single family would be better, but Troy is uncertain what will be done eventually with Birmingham's old gravel pit property.

Troy officials suggested that were Birmingham to dedicate the property as a park, it might then be possible to arrange single family zoning of the Troy lots.

Birmingham and Troy planners were consulting with the Troy property owner to see if a more definite agreement can be reached.

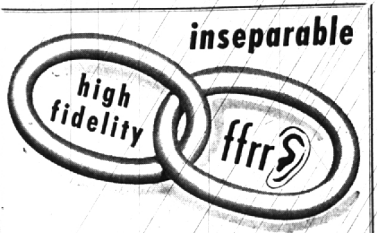
