

Area Police Radio Tie-in Advised For Hills Dept.

Bloomfield Hills city commission voted Tuesday to set up special units and advise for tie-in for a two-frequency police transmitter system.

Harry Nye, of the Pontiac police department who maintains the Hills equipment, recommended a dual-frequency system which can participate directly in an inter-city communication system.

Nye estimated the cost of changing to the split-channel system at about \$2,000, with the federal civilian defense refunding half the cost. Cost to the city then would be about \$1,000.

Mayor C. J. Eason appointed Lyman J. Craig and Dominick Vetrano, only other commissioners present, to represent the city at a meeting on city road conditions and improvements to be held.

THE COMMISSION received a request to share with Birmingham, Birmingham and Troy the expense of heating and lighting the civilian defense ground observer post on E. Main road.

The commission also approved a plan for the community and kept it share of responsibility for the community center at City View. Ford dealer's low bid of \$46,425 with a trailer was accepted by the commission for a new police car.

City Clerk Robert J. Stadler reported that one of the two fire trucks has been set up in the city offices so that voters may come in and receive instructions during election any week day between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Machines will be used for the first time in the April election.

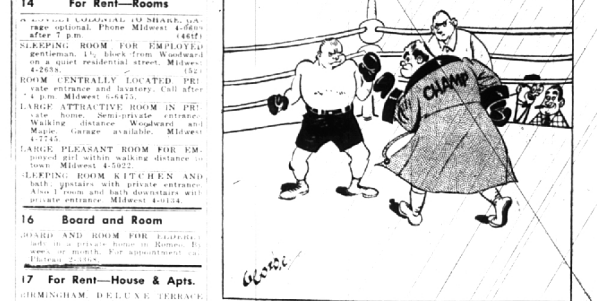
