Public to Meet West Bloomfield Candidates Tonight

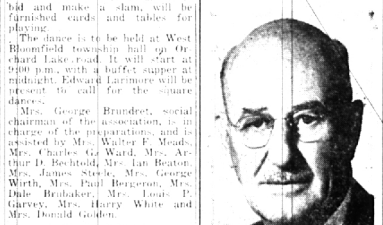
