Scoring Phenoms Invade Bloomfield Gym Friday Night

Coach Hal Trutt of Bloomfield Hills is hoping number "21" will prove unlucky for Harper Woods when it invades the Hills' gymnasium tomorrow night.

The Detroit suburb school has moved down to a straight opponents this season in the recent loss to a Joe Louis or a Charles Van Degen, Flint. Bob Johns' high-flying team aims to make Bloomfield Hills, at 14th vic-tory and wrap up the Southeast Michigan crown in the process.

The Barons have won only four games, and on paper don't promise to offer the Woods quarter match competition.

AS A STATISTIC the long skip of championship looks almost commonplace when compared to the way in which Harper's victories were accomplished. In 20 of 22 contests, 82-29, 112-25, mention just a few scores. The figures average out to an amazing 78-28 margin.

The 31-year-old Woods coach, a graduate of Western Michigan college, is enjoying his first "big" season since joining to the school three years ago, after holding assistant coaching posts at Rosford, Umm and Ocean Beach, Fla. The sudden rise to power comes as no surprise to Johns' coaches.

"THESE KIDS have played together since the 10th grade when they won 15 consecutive games as a Junior outfit," Johns said. "I knew they would eventually arrive. It was just a matter of them gaining a little savvy." Last year Harper won 10 and lost eight, finishing strong to cap its district title.

Dedication to the game has paid handsome rewards for the Harper Woods team. "The boys started working out together after school this fall and supplemented these efforts with more practice at the local YM-YWCA center in the evening," Johns said. "This dedication has characterized them all season."

A more important factor, however, has been the ideal physical equipment Johns has had to work with.
