### Torry and Eastover Schools Stress Safety

Number one lesson in two Birmingham area schools last week was that important subject, safety.

At Eastover school in Bloomfield Hills, students starred in a safety strip film photographed last week by Tony J. Spina, well known Detroit cameraman. And at Birmingham's Torry school, safety posters now line the halls as a result of the elementary school's first safety week held last Monday through Friday.

THE EASTOVER SCHOOL project was instigated by Principal William McGuire, who had the idea students would be impressed with the need for safety practices if they wrote, directed and participated in shooting a series of color slide films on the subject. Photographer Spina, who lives at 3525 Squirrel road, Bloomfield township, agreed to film the series. Spina's son Costan, a fourth grader, and daughter Julie, a second grader, attend the Hills school.

The Spina youngsters posed for some of the pictures illustrating the safe and unsafe way to behave in school. Sixth graders Susan Domzal and Karen Paulson wrote and directed the film story. Using cut-out figures, students pictured ideas they wanted to present in the film.

CARRYING OUT THE ideas in the two-hour shooting session were such "actors" as Billy Beaver. He raced down a stairway to demonstrate the wrong way to the camera, then posed for a subsequent picture lying at the bottom of the stairway, playing for his "crime."

When the strip film photos are ready in about a week, students will write an accompanying commentary. Then the safety film will be shown in all Bloomfield Hills schools.

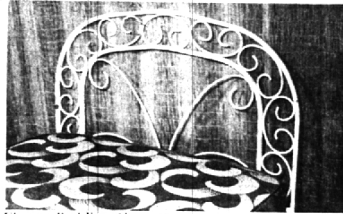
