THE ARTS OF THE birds are good for many checks which should be the tone we could all benefit from for enjoyable living. You will enjoy getting out your camera for some interesting studies at your bird feeder. A portrait is so easy to take and can be clipped on the camera lens, and you will want to take the picture about 10 - 15 inches from the bird. Plan on using a narrow aperture and a fast shutter speed. If you use black and white film, have an emulsion speed of 20, and color film with a speed of 10.

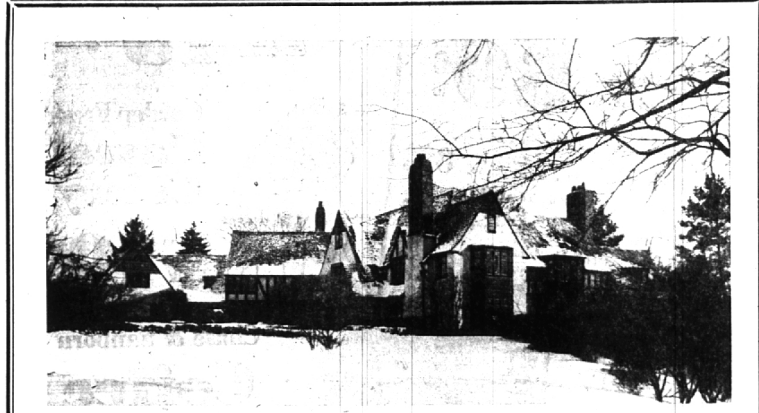
We like to attract birds to our gardens because they busy themselves destroying weed seeds and devouring insects.

They love evergreens for shelter, especially the Austrian pine. Barberries, hedges, hibernisweet, chokeberry, dogwood, mountain ash, sumac, viburnums, and hawthorns are easy favorites, and hold themselves to our climate.

In the same package you are generally always sure to find the person who is a good gardener and the lover of birds.

The severe injury we experience with evergreens generally comes as the result of a dry spell in the winter. The needles or their leaves give off water all the time. When the evergreens show signs of injury by the wind in the winter months, a burlap screen placed on the sunny and windward side will protect the plants.

IT IS A GOOD idea to prepare your evergreens for the winter by seeing that each evergreen has a mulch of some kind. Many folks place their grass clippings under.
