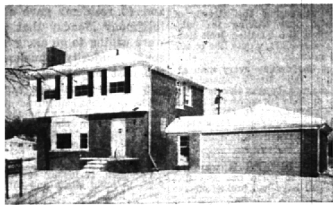
In PTA Program

People's Column Bloomfield Twp. Justice Candidate Lists Qualifications

To the Editor: Recently you published the names of candidates for the office of Justice of the Peace in Bloomfield Township, and I thank you for mentioning my name.

I think the public would be interested in knowing why I am offering my services to the Township. My attitude toward government is still idealistic. I want the government operated by educated and trained people.

Because of my education and vast experience in the legal field I could not conscientiously criticize anybody in township government unless I offered to perform a service in an efficient manner.

ALTHOUGH the justice of the peace is considered the lowest court in the land, it is still a very important office.

The justice has many functions, first, he hears misdemeanor complaints, that is, complaints for violating traffic ordinances, zoning ordinances, building code violations, disturbing the peace, and such misdemeanors.

In connection with felony complaints, he performs many important functions, namely:

He receives the first written complaint either by a citizen or law enforcement officer, and he issues the original warrant for the apprehension and arrest of felons; thereafter, he hears the first plea of the accused when brought before him on the charge contained in the complaint, and fixes reasonable bond to insure his appearance for further proceedings.

A JUSTICE of the peace then conducts a preliminary examination at which he hears witnesses to determine whether or not the proof is adequate to justify holding the accused for trial in a higher court. Indeed, all of these functions are important to all of the people in the Township.

Historically, the justice of the peace was a "conservator of the peace". Upon proper complaint or petition he has the power to conduct an investigation to determine if crimes have been committed within the township and not prosecuted by appropriate officers.

This proceeding is known as the one-man grand jury and has been used on many occasions.

Although there have been only few instances in the recent years of a justice of the peace conducting such investigations, this power is potentially a force to maintain the area free from gamblers and other insidious criminals who may attempt to invade the township.

THE OFFICE of justice of the peace has been ridiculed many times in recent years. The ridicule is based upon the fact that qualified people did not offer their services with the result that these functions were performed by barbers, blacksmiths, shop keepers, real estate men, and other persons who had no training in the law, and often had little or no education.

Currently an article appears in Current Magazine on "Horse and Buggy Justice" which points out the evils which occur when unqualified persons are selected for this important office.

IT IS BECAUSE I do not want this to happen in Bloomfield township that I have become a candidate for this office, and will conscientiously carry out the duties of this office which I consider to be very important to the well-being of the community.

The office of justice of the peace does not carry any salary and the fees are minor. You can be sure that financial remuneration is not an incentive.

My only reason for becoming a candidate is to offer to the people of Bloomfield township courteous and conscientious judicial service. If you feel that my motive is worthy, I would appreciate any assistance you can give me in publishing my views.

No Objections To Closing Carol

FRANKLIN — There were no objections to the closing of Carol road, east of Brantingham to its intersection with Irving, at the public hearing held by the Franklin village council Monday night.

Also on the agenda for the meeting is the consideration of the petition to close the portion of Normandy lying west of Irving.

According to Harold Roseberry, president, the question of heat for the village offices must also be discussed.

A letter has been received by the council from the Franklin men's association stating that due to the decline in income from hall rentals, it will be necessary for the village to pay for heating the offices, starting Jan. 1, 1957.

Ever since the village incorporated, it has been using the second floor of the community hall, owned by the association, free of charge for offices and meetings.

Watchowski added that preliminary engineering on the Evergreen was started Monday by the county drain commissioner and that construction drawings on the Evergreen sewer are scheduled for completion within the next two weeks.

Hobbycrafters Hold Benefit Tea Tonight

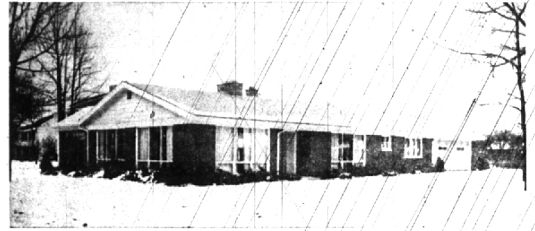

Every Deed must have a "Grantor", the seller, and a "Grantee", the buyer. A Warranty Deed which is most commonly used further contains a covenant or agreement that the Grantor will protect the Grantee against any claim. A deed must show a consideration and a correct description of the property. The Seller must affix Revenue Stamps, and the Buyer should always record the executed Deed in the Register of Deeds office.
