Mr. Neuhard is associated with Russell, Bradford, and Ward bolt and nut company, Detroit. He is a golfer, and both enjoy gardening.

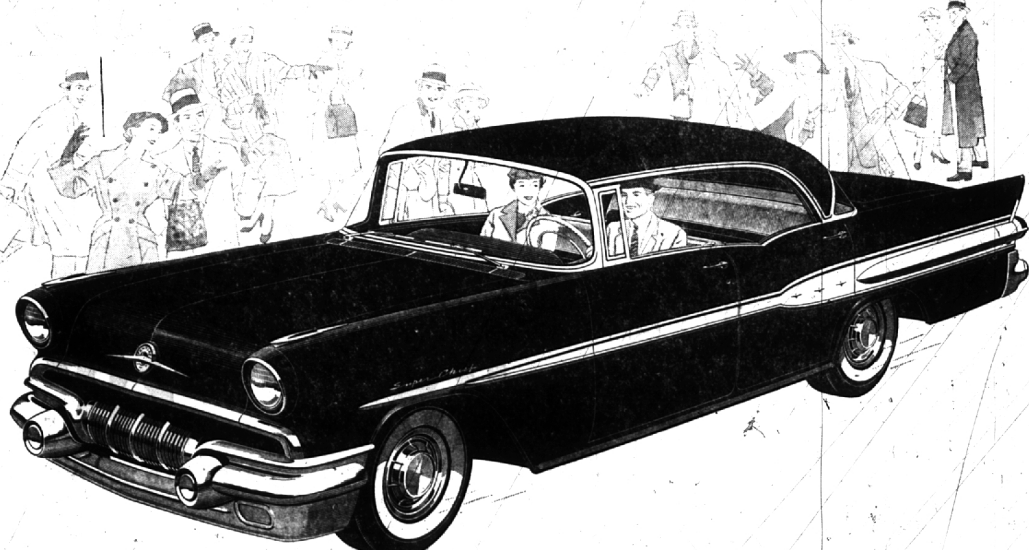
