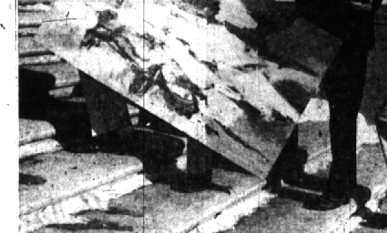

27 Million Hills School Bonds Bought

Purchase of a \$2,705,000 bond issue to finance new school facilities for the Bloomfield Hills school district was announced today.

The bonds were purchased for re-offering to the public by a group of investment firms, headed by the First of Michigan Corp. Maturing in from one to 25 years, the bonds are re-offered to yield from 2.75 to 4.25 per cent interest.

Average interest rate is 4.0178 per cent.

Eugene L. Johnson, superintendent of schools, pointed out that the sale of investment bonds is the first of two additional school buildings and two new sites for an elementary and a junior high school.

The bonds are in process of being printed and should be completed and signed in four to six weeks with the money available then, he said.

Tuesday the board began interviewing architects for the proposed school buildings.
