A Nun Who Begs with Pride, Tells of Aid to Hungarians

"The love of Christ is pushing me," is the motto of our Australian order founded and dedicated to social work, remarked Sister Pia C.S. on her visit to Birmingham last week. She told her country's needs to a few members of the Mercy League at the Safford road home of Mrs. Thomas J. Bolton Wednesday.

Sister came to this country a few months ago to obtain monetary aid for social work in their country. She is soliciting funds to build a wing on their Mother House in Vienna, to provide additional shelter for Hungarian refugees, and to study our ways of dealing with charities.

SISTER PIA is a member of the Sister of Caritas Socialis, meaning sister of special love, an Australian order founded in 1919.

Dr. Hildegarde Burjan founded the order and today, 220 sisters carry on the work. Their mother house is located in Prameragasse, Vienna, Austria.

"I BEG every day," remarked the nun, her gray hair smoothed back under a tight blue cap, "I beg for the homeless and poor of Austria."

"We want to build a shelter large enough to house about 100 aged people, and to temporarily house Hungarian refugees, related Sister. "Only modest shelter," she hastily replied, "today the Mother house is a haven for 60 or more Hungarian refugees at a time—on their way to more permanent and new homes."

"We help hearts to hearts," she said simply. "You needn't know one another's language to understand when people need baths and food and sleep."

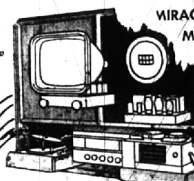

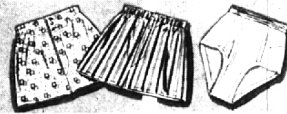

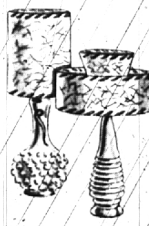
