Here we go again... Poinsettias are short day plants. It is true that you can give them good care, place them out in the yard this summer for lots of sunshine, etc.

**IF YOU HAVE** a sunny location, inclined to be damp, do plan on establishing a Katsura tree as you sketch your spring garden.

The Katsura tree has the heart-shaped leaves of the Redwood tree, but has superior characteristics. The tree will grow to be 20 feet high. When it is time for the new leaves to come out, they have to push off the old, making the tree nearly always in leaf.

Leaves are deep green on top and silver beneath. Leaf stalk and veins are often red. In Fall the leaves are purplish red and yellow, especially vivid if you root-prune the tree in the Spring. It is a tree which is dense at the base and pyramidal in shape.

This winter, so many of you are placing your house plants on ra-

diators for their display location. Remember, you should plan on placing insulation between the heat and your plants.

**IF YOU HAVE** to be away from home for a few days you will find it handy to invert a deep freeze bag over your plants after you have generously watered them. Then secure the wide opening to the bottom of the pot with wire or string.

African violets will get along better than if you were home. Geraniums will not like this idea, because they want to be kept on the dry side. This method is good for

up to two weeks' absence.

This is a good time to evaluate your houseplants. Styles change in their selection, and the cycles are related to accepted styles in home decorations. A home decorator often assumes that a specific vertical line of a plant species is important to set off her choice of colors, fabrics, and textures in the total home.
