Funeral services for Charles R. Walton of Wheaton, Ill., Chrysler sales executive, will be conducted at 11 a.m. today from Bell chapel, W. R. Hamilton Co., Birmingham. Walton, 38, was killed Sunday when his F-9-P jet collided with another plane over Albuquerque, N. M. A Naval Reserve officer, he was on a flight from Glenview Naval Air station in Illinois to Marine Naval Air Station in California.

Walton was born in Detroit and graduated from Cranbrook school, Bloomfield Hills, and Kenyon college, Gambier, O. He joined Chrysler Corp. in 1946 and at the time of his death was new car sales manager for the Chicago region. Surviving are his wife, Loretta, two children, Charles, 10, and DeWane, 6; his father, Hiram L. Walton of Lake Angelus, and two sisters, Mrs. Arthur S. Hudson and Mrs. Charles B. O'Neil, both of Birmingham.

EDITH GRACE MACLANE, 83, of 110 W. Maple, Troy, died Jan. 17 at Brachum convalescent home, after a short illness. Born May 22, 1873, in Oil City, Pa., she moved to the Birmingham area two years ago, from New York City. The boy was admitted to the hospital with a concussion after a car driven by his father, Donald, 42, collided with another car Friday on 14 Mile road near Pierce, Birmingham.

The other motorist, Mrs. Glenna M. Cooper, 51, of Rochester, was treated for multiple contusions at Beaumont hospital, and later released. MacDonald suffered a fractured finger. He received emergency treatment at Beaumont. A daughter, Bonnie May, 9, was admitted to Northwest Grace with possible concussion, after emergency treatment at Beaumont of head and face lacerations. She was later discharged from the Detroit hospital. Police ticketed MacDonald for failure to yield the right-of-way to oncoming traffic.
