

# Parties Original

For those who might be entertaining large or small groups for a Valentine party, why not make it a Stunts party? The following are stunts that may be used for older children, teens or adults.

1. Put ice cream in two dishes placed 24 inches apart on a table. Tie two spoons together with an 18-inch string. Seat a contestant in front of each dish of ice cream and hand each one a spoon. They are to try to finish their dish of ice cream first by pulling and tugging at the spoon on their own end of the string. Hint—tie a large towel around their necks, they'll need it.

2. **PLAY THIS GAME** down on the floor. Six to eight players to a game and one "whammer." Players are equipped with a two-foot length of string, on one end of which is tied a large cork. Corks are placed in center of circle, players grasping other end of string. Whammer holds small frying pan by handle, upside down, directly above corks.

He raises dice and if seven or eleven turns up, he tries to "wham" the pan down onto as many corks as possible before the players can jerk them away.

Those who don't get away are out of the game. If any other numbers turn up, players must not move their corks or they are automatically out.

3. **WITH AN EMPTY** quart fruit jar as a bull's eye, try this target-toss. Place the fruit jar on a layer cake pan. Place these inside a dish pan. Seat the player about ten feet from the target and provide him with about 10 peanuts in the shells. For each peanut that he tosses into the fruit jar, he gets 50 points, cake pan 25 and dish pan 10.

4. **PREVIOUS** to the party, freeze into the center of ice cubes, candy valentine hearts. Seat the guests around a table, give each one of the ice cubes, a candle and a thickness of newspaper to catch the dripping. Object: to see who can light his candle and with it melt the ice to get to the candy heart first.

5. **HAVE SOME LARGE** sheets of paper, a fat red crayon and a blindfold. Have players, one at a

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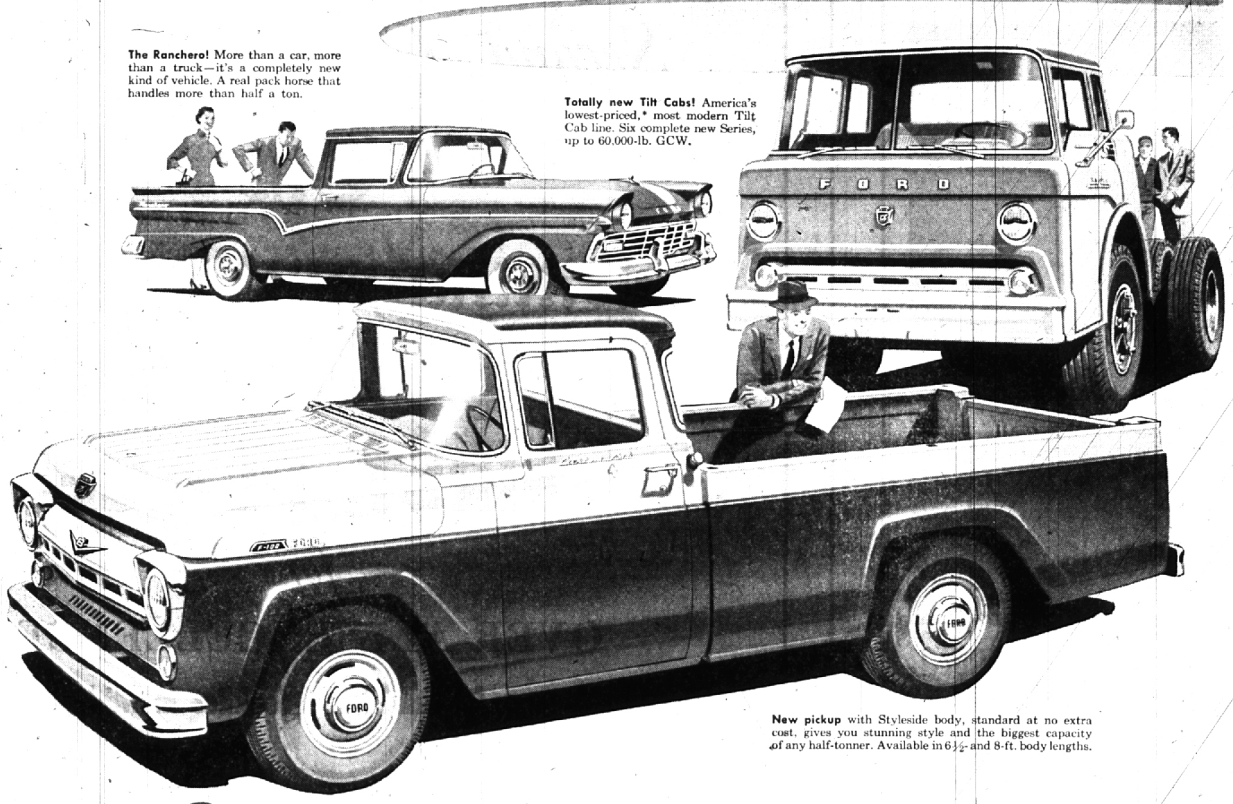
