

People's Column Summer School Is Needed Here, Writer Suggests

To the Editor: Has anyone ever wondered why there is no summer school in Birmingham? Probably no one except the parents of the children that have to go to Pontiac, Royal Oak or Highland Park. This isn't bad enough, but the thing that is really irksome, is the fact that summer school in these places started on Monday, June 17.

Our Birmingham schools didn't get out till the 19th and school wasn't officially over till the 21st when they had to go back for their cards. So the first chance they had to get to summer school was on June 20, and then they were enrolling without knowing what their final marks were.

THEY WERE already three days late (summer school regulations only permit two days of absence), and some of the classes were filled by that time so children couldn't even take the courses they needed. No Latin is taught in summer school so if that is what the student needed, he was completely out of luck.

In calling the Birmingham Board of Education to ask why our children had to go so late that they

couldn't even start summer school on time, the answer was "I didn't know that." (that the summer schools started three days before Birmingham was out). This was "top brass" speaking not just a secretary. Well, if he didn't know, who does?

Why should our children have to be shipped out to other cities? Summer school isn't free, you know. So far, it has cost \$85.50 to \$85.00 tuition, \$3.50 for the book and \$1.00 lab fee.

Who can do something about this? I'd like to know.
