Local Physician Directed Research On Heart Machine

The continued growth of heart surgery is described as last year's outstanding achievement in cardiovascular medicine in the 1956 annual report of the American and Michigan Heart Associations.

Dr. F. D. Dorrill of Woodberry road, Bloomfield Hills directed the medical-engineering research team whose work led to the development

of the mechanical heart. Their research served "to open the door" on the vast and important field of heart surgery.

In 1956 the artificial heart-lung machine moved out of the experimental laboratory and became a standby of the operating room. The report points out that surgeons can now repair many life-shortening heart defects only recently held incurable.
