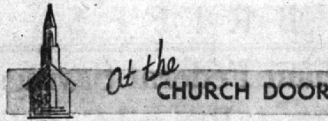

They got the burned roof off Kirk in the Hills just in time for the record rainfall that inundated the area on Monday of last week. Only one final section remained when the down-pour ended, and it came off late Monday afternoon. Someone suggested the Kirk might be a good place to go swimming at this point.

And speaking of water, Rev. Dr. Harold C. DeWindt, the Kirk minister, accompanied by his teenage son, David, will be cruising on the waters for 36 days. He sails today aboard the liner Argentina for a 15,000 mile journey to Buenos Aires. He'll conduct Sunday services aboard the vessel each week.

LAST YEAR HE took a similar journey aboard another ship owned by the same line.

He plans a leisurely existence, he says. After the hectic days he spent after the grim Kirk fire, he deserves it.

"It'll be a great chance to read and study and think," he said last week.

And we'll bet (if that's proper for a church editor) that he comes down the gangplank with a stack of notes ready to incorporate in next winter's sermons.

It wasn't just the clergy and members of the Kirk in the Hills congregation who were heartsick when they saw their beautiful church in flames last month.

Many skilled workmen who since 1955 home poured their time and talents into the building project were called back to the scene on the night of the fire.

Said Reed Dixon, safety engineer for the construction company, "I saw men around here that night with tears in their eyes."

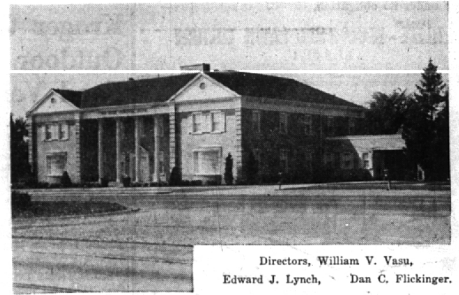
