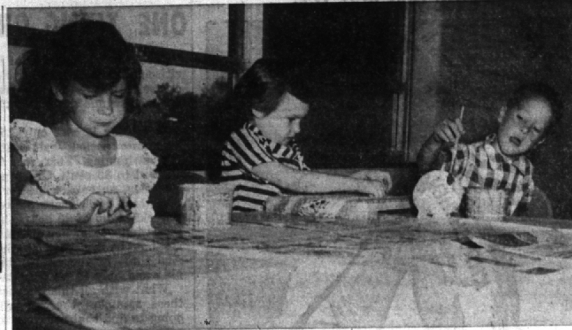


**Schedule Changed At Science Church**

**North Church Moderator Voices Protest**

Statements made by Dr. George V. Bohman, published in a recent article in the Birmingham Eccentric, were challenged this week by Thomas G. Long, moderator of North Congregational church.

Dr. Bohman's statements were in connection with the merger of the national bodies of the Congregational Christian churches and Evangelical and Reformed church into the United Church of Christ. Formal acceptance of the merger by individual churches is still pending.

Dr. Bohman, a trustee of the Detroit Congregational association, had said in his statement that North church, at Northwestern and Laber roads, and several other area churches of that denomination, was "opposed to the merger."

Dr. Bohman also stated the area churches "have unanimously voted to maintain their independent position as autonomous Congregational churches."

IN A LETTER to The Birmingham Eccentric, Long said, "North church has many members opposed to the merger and others equally good who favor it."

He added that "North church is doing its best through its ministers, officers and representatives to get full information first hand upon all aspects of, and in relation to, the merger pro and con, and hopes when the proper time arrives to take intelligent action in accordance with the intent of a resolution adopted at a special meeting Feb. 20, 1957."

At that time, Long explained, the members, without a dissenting vote, declared the intention of

North church in the matter. They resolved to decide on the merger when and if, and not before, a constitution for the merged United Church was submitted for acceptance or rejection by individual churches.

THE MODERATOR ADDED that previously the congregation had voted 192 to 8 against approval of the merger, when the question was originally submitted to them by the Congregational church's General Council. Vote then was 192 to 8.

In a later move in May, Long said, the church moved without a dissenting vote to join the newly formed National Association of Congregational Christian churches. The vote provided for sending a delegate to the association's next meeting.

Long said the executive council of North church sent its minister, Rev. Ralph H. Reed, as an observer to the Cleveland meeting at which the two denominations acted upon the merger.

THE PROTEST AGAINST statements made by Dr. Bohman in The Birmingham Eccentric followed an earlier objection from the Rev. Robert D. Dewey, minister of the Congregational church of Birmingham.

In a statement published in The Eccentric last week, Mr. Dewey said Dr. Bohman's inclusion of the Birmingham church with churches opposed to the merger was "highly presumptuous."

Birmingham church, Mr. Dewey said, is "at the moment completely neutral."

**St. Mary's Church Country Festival Slated Next Week**

Plans are completed for the Lake Angelus guild "Country Festival" Saturday, July 27, on the grounds at St. Mary's-in-the-Hills at Joslyn and Greenfield roads, outside the old schoolhouse on the former Scripps estate.

The annual country fair is now a tradition with the women of the guild, who have scheduled this year's event from 2 p.m. through the dinner hour.

About 500 to 600 people attended last year's fair to enjoy events such as the children's pony rides, shopping at the baked goods counter, while elephant table and hat bazaars, and trying their skill at the shooting gallery. Popcorn, cotton candy, and a church supper furnish the gastronomical enjoyment.
