OTHER AREA competitions will be held at St. Clair, between St. Clair, Algonac and Anchor Bay (New Baltimore) and at Walled Lake between Walled Lake, Fen-ton and Huron valley.

Friday, Aug. 2, the St. Clair winner will play at Birmingham, and the Walled Lake winner will be paired with the Southfield champion.

SATURDAY, AUG. 3, the district finals will be played at Southfield High, bringing together the winners of the St. Clair-Birmingham and Walled Lake-Southfield games.

Rockets Grab B. Ruth Reins In Birmingham

The Rockets served notice this week that they are going to make a determined battle to keep their Birmingham Babe Ruth League title for another year.

Tim Springer, ace Rocket pitcher, was knocked out of the box in the fifth after Phil Isbell homered but George Didier proved effective in relief and the Rocket bats kept sounding.

THE CHIEFS victory over the Spartans was spoiled by Stenger's four hit pitching and a batting attack led by Bobby Townsend and Larry Kelly. Kelly singled home two runs in the third as the chiefs took a 5 to 1 lead.
