**Careful Police Work Nets Thief For Hills Dept.**

Roland C. Coleman, 959 LaSalle, Pontiac, was convicted on a simple larceny charge Monday in Bloomfield Hills after admitting Saturday he rifled a car in the Fox and Hounds restaurant parking lot on July 9.  
 His arrest last week by Capt. Walter Slesuter of the Bloomfield Hills police department climaxed several days of intensive work by police and close cooperation with the Waterford township police department.  
 Millard W. Cleveland, 5138 Farm road, Pontiac, reported to Hills police that he had returned to the parking lot after dinner to find it rifled of a briefcase, filing rack and eight-millimeter projector.  
 Calls the following day from Mrs. Delbert Haviland, 1063 Voorheis road, Pontiac, reporting an abandoned filing rack and from another resident of the area reporting her children had found a briefcase caused Hills police to believe the thief was a Waterford area resident.  
 A check with Waterford police revealed that an officer had made a routine check of cars behind the Huron theater July 9. He had discovered Coleman seated in a 1949 Ford with an open briefcase at his feet. Significantly, it was a gray case with red binding. As he had no charges, the officer let Coleman go but his suspicions were aroused as he "really tore out."  
 Slesuter obtained the address from Stokes' report and arrested Coleman.  
 In view of Coleman's previous good record and the fact that he was out of work the charge against him was reduced to simple larceny. He was fined \$40 and \$10 costs and placed on six months' probation to Gordon C. Pagueau, county probation officer.
