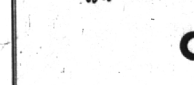
Gayle Rogers will return home with her mother and her brother to get ready for a month's visit to Denver, Colo.

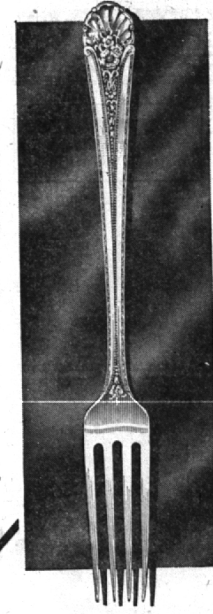

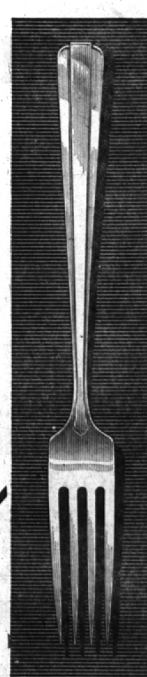
