To permit construction of 10 multiple dwellings, the Birmingham city commission this week vacated Buckingham street from E-ton west to the Grand Trunk rail-road. Vacation is contingent upon new owners Albert Boney and Harold Garber meeting several conditions which include proper easements and drainage. The land is part of a large triangle which some months ago was rezoned by circuit court action. The city contended that single residence use was reasonable, but the court held it should be used for business.
