

Harlan A. Davis Spending Summer At Survey Camp

Among 48 June graduates of Michigan high schools making business with pleasure in Wyoming this summer is Harlan A. Davis, 6190 Franklin road, Bloomfield township.

He is at a scenic University of Michigan surveying camp near the Grand Teton mountains.

He and the other youths are participating in an eight-week "high way engineering side" program sponsored by the Michigan state highway department and the Michigan road builders' association.

Their headquarters is the U-W's Camp Davis at Jackson Hole, 6000 feet above sea level and 75 miles south of Yellowstone National park.

The purpose of their encampment is to learn the fundamentals of surveying through a course offered by the university's department of civil engineering.

The graduates have passed the state civil service examination for highway engineering aides, and will be eligible for immediate employment with the highway department following successful completion of the summer program. If they decide to go on to college, they can get educational leave from the department, and the course will be credited toward their engineering degree.

U-M student assistants. The Michigan Road Builders' association contributes \$150 toward each student's expenses at the camp.

After hours, and on weekends, students hike, fish, ride horses from a nearby dude ranch, climb mountains and play softball against other engineering students at the camp. Sight-seeing trips to Yellowstone and Grand Teton National Parks, Palisades Dam and other points are scheduled for the weekends.

The program is now in its fifth year. Accompanying the students are Assistant Professor Donald N. Cortright, camp director; Professor Ralph M. Berry, Assistant Professor Robert H. Harris, Associate Professor Lloyd T. Cheney and Wayne State University, and terrain.
