The need to hold Kirk in the Hills church services at Bloomfield Hills high school after the opening of school is posing some problems for the Hills board of education.

The board has promised to permit the church to use the school gym as long as needed. All extra costs to the schools will be taken care of by the church.

Negotiations between church and school board are proceeding smoothly through intermediary Karl E. Scott, of Lakecrest, Bloomfield Hills, who is a member of both.

The church planned originally to hold services at the school until September. Anticipating that the undercroft of the burned church would be reconsecrated by then.

removal of the entire roof of the church will make the undercroft unusable until about December.

Consequently, the school board is making arrangements for janitor services, heating, floor coverings, and seating for the congregation, which totaled 850 at the first service in the school.

At a meeting last week, the school board sought a way to protect gymnasium floors from mud which will inevitably be tracked in as fall and winter weather hit. Solution lies in providing additional aisle carpeting, the board feels.

WHILE THE FOLDING chairs remain standing in the gym from Sunday to Sunday through the summer, janitors will have to fold them away after services during the school year.

Often the chairs will have to be set up on Saturday or Sunday morning, after Friday night basketball games.

The school board may purchase additional folding chairs to accommodate the large Kirk congregation in fall, when only 400 chairs will be on hand at the high school. Additional chairs "new" at the school has been brought from other Hills schools for graduation ceremonies, and will have to be returned in the fall.

Thermosets which are usually turned down to 60° for the week-ends will have to be reset for Sunday mornings.
