Outland's Wins Metamora; Enters Wallace Show

Local riders from Outland's and other riding stables within the area will enter the Team Competition at Wallace School of Horsemanship at 10 Mile and Beech roads Saturday and Sunday.

In the recent Metamora horse show, Outland Riding Stable ran away with 28 ribbons—the lion's share of horsemanship events.

MARILYN COLE on Cat Boots took third place in Junior Hunter Hack; third in Junior Working Hunter, Outland's Hunter; first in Ladies Conformation Hunter; second in Oakland Conformation Hunter; first in Conformation Horseman; second in Amateur; second, Junior Working Hunter; fourth, Junior Reserve Junior Working Hunter Championship; second in Junior Hunt Seat; third in Grand Champion Hunter Club.

Joe Racine on Kora took fourth in Junior Open Jumpers; fourth, Junior Handy Working Hunter; first 15-18 age group; first in Junior Hunt Seat; first in the AHSRA Horsemanship Over Fences; first in Junior Hunt Seat; third in Green Working Hunter Stake.

MAUDE COOPER on Home Sweet Home was third in Horsemanship on the Flat, 14 years old; fourth in Junior Hunt Seat; and first in ASPCA Horsemanship Over Fences; fourth in Junior Open Jumpers.

Joe Racine on Revelation took third in Working Hunter Hack by Amateurs and fourth in Junior Working Hunter.

MARIE HAMMILL, of Outland Stables but residing at Metamora, was Junior Equitation Champion of the show. She took first in Horsemanship on the Flat, 15-18 year olds; first in Advanced Horsemanship Over Fences; and second in the Green Working Hunter Hack, among other victories.
