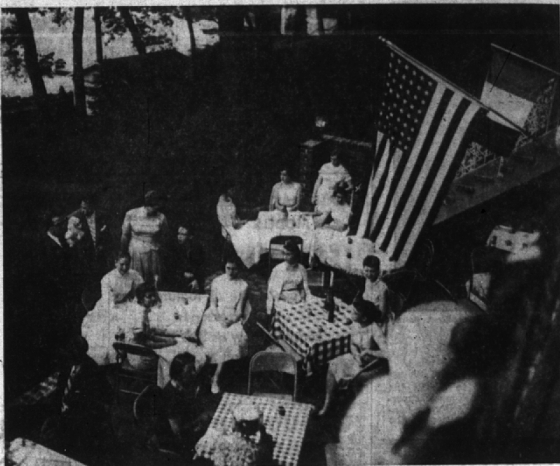
The departing ninth graders are invited to a party in the Barnum cafeteria tomorrow at 8 p.m. As this is their last year at Barnum, "everything is on the house."
