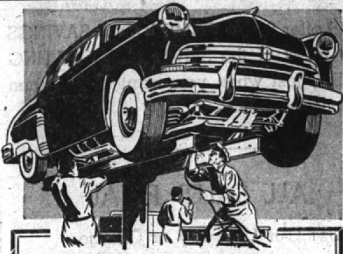


**Birmingham Coeds Elected To Society**
