**JUNE BUG**  
When the mother skunk and six baby skunks were confronted by a bug bear the mother turned to her children and said, "Let us spray!"  
And with that corker out of our tanks we turn seriously to the problems of insect and disease control in your yards and gardens.  
**SOFT BROWN SCALE:**  
These nasty little humps looking somewhat like dark lady-bugs appear under the twigs of yews and quite a few other shrubs. They are beginning to hatch now—at least two weeks earlier than in 1956.  
**SPRAY NOW** with MALATHION and at least two subsequent sprays about 10 days apart. If you have any money left and any energy left do a fourth one ten days after the third.  
**OYSTER SHELL SCALE:**  
Wait until about the first of July and then sock the blighters with 3 sprays of MALATHION ten days apart.  
**ELM TREES (Dutch Elm Disease):**  
In general two sprays of DDT in an oil emulsion should be applied—one in the dormant period (before the buds show) and one in early July. (An exception can be made in young trees up to 20 feet tall. If the trees have been sprayed twice a year for the last 2 or 3 years and have also been sprayed once this year then this summer spray can be skipped.)  
For this summer spray use D-D-IDE diluted to 4 oz. of D-D-IDE to 1 gallon of water.

**CAUTIONS:**  
Use as high a pressure as possible with your equipment.  
Cover entire tree, trunk as well as branches, beginning at the top of the tree and working downward.  
Do not apply so heavily that the liquid runs down the trunk and forms puddles at the base.  
Do not spray in a high wind as this spray will injure evergreens, maples, bleeding hearts, delphinium, privet, etc.  
Note:—We mention it at this date so that you can hire someone to do trees too large for your equipment. Be prepared!  
**CATERPILLARS:**  
These slinkers can be put to sleep with a good going over with D-D-IDE at the ratio of 6 teaspoonfuls to a gallon of water. Don't stand under the trees while you spray—unless of course you like to feel them crawling around in your hair and on your neck. They are great foliage eaters but by heck we can't get them to eat the spinach.  
**MOSQUITOES:**  
D-D-IDE again comes to the front to make your yard more pleasant by controlling the birth rate of baby "mosques." You simply spray EVERYTHING with D-D-IDE at the rate of 6 teaspoonfuls to a gallon of water... lawn, shrubs, under the shrubs, flower beds, etc. Two or three applications during the summer will provide the maximum possible control.  
**ROSE CHAFERS (BEETLES):**  
Whango! with ISOTOX.
