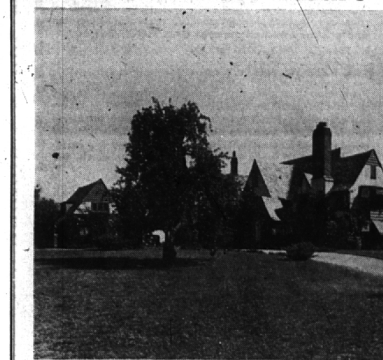

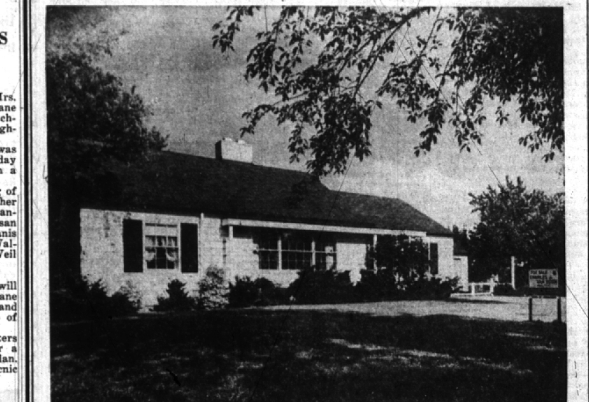
### Hold Picnic Lunch
