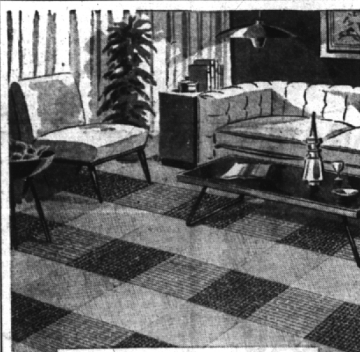

POTPOURRI . . .

is supposed to mean a mixture of fragrant flower petals and spices or a musical or literary medley. Call it what you will. THIS pot is a brew of work and fun and fragrance and vice-versa.

1. A modicum of enjoyment of the yard comes from reduction of mosquitos. Spray every inch—flowers, shrubs, lawn—with D-D-IDE to reduce the howling horde of blood-thirsty dye bombers.

2. Set up your terrace, patio, lawn, backyard, gravel pit or what have you with a BIG BOY GRILL to grill some meat over CHARCOAL fired by GRILL-LITE (which doesn't explode). Also a lovely GOODWIN GRILL which sets (sits) (fits) into a pipe in the ground OR into your fireplace in the winter. 4. Oh, praises! The fairy rings are with us again—little circles in the lawn (usually where anyone passing by can see them) where the grass won't grow but the toadstoos will. These are the places where the little fairies dance on moonlit nites and wear out the grass. When they are tired of dancing they sit on the stools. It is quaint, isn't it? But if YOU don't like fairies then you must whiten the dance floor with HYDRATED LIME—you old meansies.

5. Two magnificent terra cotta pots in glazed turquoise found their way into our little emporium. They are breathtaking for someone's patio or terrace. They are UNDER priced at \$88.00 each. The one who gets these will be the envy of the subdivision or the estate or the county, or Rugdate.

6. Spray hollyhocks and delphinium frequently with BORDEAUX.

7. We remind you here that most items in CAPS are items WE care for in case you thought we were an eleemosynary institution).

8. We can light your barbecue area with electric, candles or kerosene lighting fixtures. For gas call the Consumer's Power Co. (Art Blakeslee).

9. Softwood cuttings are easily made at this season.

10. A new addition to our pet supply line is PET-ASOL—Dry Shampoo for dogs and cats, flea killer for dogs, deodorizer for cats and dogs. Mighty pretty package!

11. European corn borers can be controlled by requiring passports or by spraying with DDT CORN EARWORM DROPS placed on the silk will burp the borers.

12. Beans, beets, carrots and—ugh—turnips can be sown now for a late crop.

13. Give your lettuce an abundance of H₂O from now on.

14. To reduce the abundance of H₂O in your basement put CALCIUM CHLORIDE in a MIDWEST DE-HUMIDIFIER in the wet area of your cellar.

15. Dress your asparagus bed now with DRIED CATTLE MANURE or wet cattle manure or AGRICO 5-10-5 fertilizer. Let the stuff grow all summer.

16. Cutworms are late diners so put BUGETA or SNAROL on the ground in the evening and also spray DDT on the ground.

17. Spray or dust beans with ROTENONE. Cover UNDERNEATH THE LEAVES (we do not sell underneaths). Make 4 applications at 10-day intervals.

18. BUCKWHEAT HULLS spread 1 1/4" to 2" deep on your cultivated and weeded flower beds will eliminate your weed problem for the rest of the summer.

19. Use BORKIL in the holes in your lilacs and other borer infested stuff.

20. Oil your lawn mower each time you use it if you want to continue to use it.
