"If you can't lick 'em, join 'em," is a saying we've all often heard. It applies sometimes, where children are concerned. If you are confronted with a party for a girl anywhere from eight to twelve years old, try a drama party.

At any of these ages, they love to dress-up and dramatize. So why not capitalize on their interests and give them a party they'll love. It is a fairly simple thing to get together a good supply of dress-up clothes, costumes, scarves, ribbons, sashes, old jewelry, hats, etc. The costumes should include some animal ones too. Have all of these in a large box, in the middle of the room.

If you are having about 12 guests, divide them into groups of four. Put each group in a different room of the house so they can develop their skits and work out their costumes secretly. You can give each group a paper on which is written two or three suggested thoughts to give them a start. For instance, "Eloise and her dog Skippy were inseparable companions. The day she took him with her to the circus..."

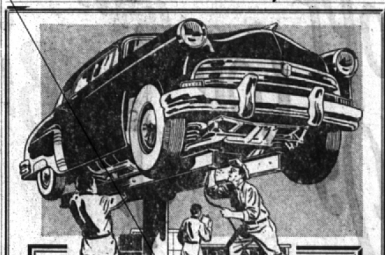
Or "Nurse Helen tried hard to amuse little Anne, during her long stay in Hayes hospital so she was particularly happy the day the traveling vaudeville act visited the ward and Anne was so amused by the..."

You can think up any number of similar leads for them to go ahead and build their stories and act them out. Or, they may use some established plot like Cinderella or Red Riding Hood. They may even develop one entirely original. Children are very resourceful and will surprise you with what they can come up with.

IN the room where they work out their skit and put on their costumes, there should be a comb and some make-up supplies so they can complete their costuming.

Give them at least the first 45 minutes of the party time to get their skit developed and then ring

a bell or call them to the party room and each group in turn, presents its show. It's fun to invite the mothers to this party, too, and while the girls are preparing their act, serve the mothers coffee while you chat. This way the girls have a bigger audience to view their artistic accomplishments.
