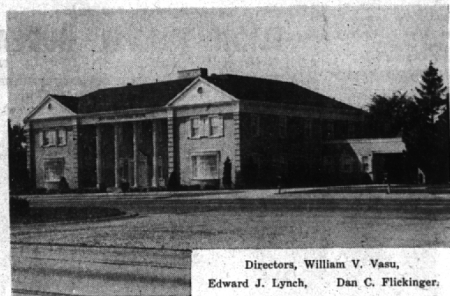
B'ham Music Major Honored at U of M
