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Delay Lathrup's Pollution Suit

LATHRUP — Circuit Court Judge H. Russel Holland heard Lathrup's plea for postponement of the State's Rouge river pollution suit to give the city more time to determine what course it would take to abate the pollution.

Holland set June 25 as the next court date for the city, which is allegedly polluting the Rouge river via the Evans ditch which accepts Lathrup sewage.

LATHRUP is trying to join with five other communities — Southfield, Troy, Birmingham, Bloomfield Hills and Bloomfield township—in an interceptor which would carry sewage from the area to Detroit for treatment.

Northern communities talked about the project—now in its sixth year of discussion—at a meeting

in Birmingham Tuesday night, and Wednesday Lathrup was to try to decide what means they would use to end Rouge pollution.

Reject Commercial Rezoning Requests

SOUTHFIELD — Petitions requesting commercial zoning for two pieces of land in Greenfield Villa subdivision were denied last week by township board.

One petitioner, Lawrence Devine wanted to build on lot 28 a row of multiple dwellings which, according to Southfield zoning law, is not allowed in the township.
