Lathrup Doctor Buried Tuesday



H. HOYT GILBERT Retired Engineer Dies in Florida

Dr. Eugene V. Gourley, 43, of 27426 Norningside, Lathrup Hills, died Friday at St. Carmel hospital, Detroit. Born Aug. 26, 1913, in Mexico, he received his medical education at the University of Detroit and Wayne State university.

Dr. Gourley interned at Grace hospital and served as surgical resident at St. Carmel until March, 1941, when he entered the Army for five years, two of them overseas. He moved to Lathrup five years ago from Detroit and had his office at 16091 James Couzens highway. He was a member of Wayne County and Michigan State medical societies, and a fellow of the American and International colleges of surgeons.

Surviving are his wife, Thea Gourley; three daughters, Mrs. Jeanette Partridge, and two sons, Robert and Eugene V., Jr. Funeral services will be held from Jehovah's Lutheran church with burial in Aecia Park cemetery, Arroyo, Ariz., at 11 a. m. Monday at the west chapel, W. R. Hamilton Co., Pontiac.

MISS ADA G. DEWAR, 82, of 679 West Maple, died Monday at her home, after a three-month illness. A Birmingham resident for 15 years, Miss Dewar was born Sept. 11, 1874, in London, Ont., Canada. She was the owner and operator of Dora Ludwig Inc., a ladies apparel shop in Detroit, and retired in 1954. At one time, Miss Dewar had been a buyer for Joseph Horne Co. of Pittsburgh, Pa.

She was a member of St. James Episcopal church, Soroptimist International and Women's City club. Miss Dewar is survived by a niece, Mrs. James W. Sutton, Jr., of Birmingham. Until 11 a. m. today, the body will be at the Bell chapel, W. R. Hamilton Co., 824 East Maple. Funeral services will be at 1 p. m. today from St. James Episcopal church, with interment at Woodlawn cemetery.

JOSEPH E. CORNELL, 52, of 21062 W. Rutland, Southfield township, died March 8 in Beaumont hospital, suffering from an obstruction in the throat which restricted his breathing. He was rushed to the hospital where he was pronounced dead.

A doctor on the scene opened Cornell's chest and massaged the heart for five minutes until it responded. The throat obstruction was removed in a five-hour operation, but four hours later, Cornell died.

A millwright and truck driver for Ford Motor Co., Cornell was born June 2, 1904, in Detroit, and came to Southfield four years ago. Surviving are his wife, Ellen; a son, J. E. Cornell; four grand-children, Lester Bolton of Royal Oak, Mrs. Nettie Howard of Jackson and Carl Miller of Berkley, and seven grandchildren. Services were Monday from the Lawrence F. Schmidt funeral home in Royal Oak, with burial in White Chapel cemetery.

MRS. HECTOR P. SANDOVAL, (nee Hazel M. Leonard), 61, Manistique, formerly of Birmingham, died suddenly Monday at her home. Born in Manistique August 23, 1895, she was married Sept. 23, 1918, in Flint.

Mrs. Sandoval was a member of the First Baptist church in Birmingham. She leaves her husband; a son, Staff Sgt. Patrick Sandoval, USAF, in California; three daughters, Mrs. Roderick Gable of Detroit and Mrs. Henry Hendricks and Mrs. John Eberly of Birmingham; and 13 grandchildren. Memorial service for Kenneth John McDonald, former Birmingham resident, will be conducted at 2 p. m. Saturday from First Presbyterian church, Birmingham. Mr. McDonald, 65, died suddenly Friday at Clearwater, Fla. He was born April 21, 1891, in Baddeck, Nova Scotia.

In 1946, Mr. McDonald retired from his position as assistant director of taxes for General Motors Corp. His job had been held since Mr. McDonald joined GM in 1925, at the Buick division in Flint, became chief estimator of Buick in 1929, and was transferred to the central office in Detroit in 1933.

IN 1948, Mr. McDonald and his wife, the former Lillian MacKenzie, moved from Birmingham to Haverrill, N. H., where she died in 1955. Survivors include three sons, Weldon of Birmingham, Lorne S. of Grassy Pointe and Kenneth of Metuchen, N. J., and five grandchildren.

Better 'Brand' Your Hub Caps Against Rustlers

If you want to keep those shiny hub caps on your car, better have them engraved. Or else scratch some identification on them. That was the advice of Birmingham police this week, who cited an example to prove it's well to "brand" hub caps for protection against rustlers. Birmingham Police Officer LaMar Gelibert notified four hub caps on the ice at Quanton lake which was patrolled early Sunday when he picked up the cast iron type tires he learned they had been thrown there.

THE HUB CAPS were unerringly engraved with an identifying number on the reverse side, stating the owner's name, address, license number and make of car. Knowing the hub caps could be identified as stolen property, the motorists who took them had tossed them away.

Police notified Emil Chockov, of Royal Oak, who retrieved his stolen hub caps at the station. In urging Birmingham residents to mark their own hub caps, Police Chief Maxwell said that since the first of the year there had been 49 cases of larceny from an auto, most of them hub caps, tires and wheels. Cases have been on the upswing since warmer weather arrived.
