The program will also include a one act play to be presented by the Lathrup Players.

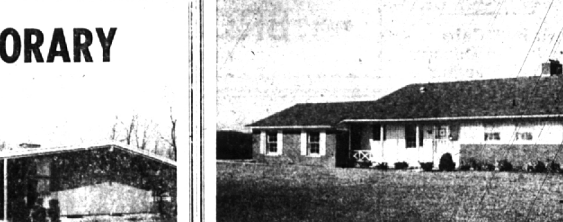
