B'ham 'Regents' Candidates Wind Up Election Tours

Although two Birmingham women are running on opposing tickets for University of Michigan board of regents in Monday's election, it is possible for both to be elected.

While Edna Jocelyn Watt, Republican, and Irene Ellis Murphy, Democrat, are competing for a vacancy traditionally held by a woman, there actually are two openings on the board to be filled in the statewide election. If enough voters split their ballots, and vote for the two women (instead of the woman-man party slates), both could serve.

Both Mrs. Murphy and Mrs. Watt have been visiting various college campuses this week as they wind up active campaigns. Students at the University of Michigan have been especially active in the campaign. Democratic student committees sent out 5,000 letters for Mrs. Murphy. The student Republican club distributed 7,000 letters to fellow students of voting age.

School Guidance Practices Class Is Offered Here

In response to local requests, Michigan State University will offer an extension course this spring term at Birmingham.

The course to begin April 3, is entitled "Guidance Practices in the School."

Interested residents of the Birmingham area may register at the first session of the class, according to the announcement from the East Lansing campus. The course will cover theory and practice of graduate or undergraduate credit. The class will meet from 7 to 9 p.m., at Birmingham high school.

The course is designed to give practical help to teachers, counselors, and to administrators in providing guidance services. Particular attention will be given to the problems which confront members of the class. Opportunity will be provided for a group of teachers from a school to study the improvement of guidance services for the entire school.

B'ham Patrol Boy Will Win May Trip To Washington

Birmingham was named today by Automobile club of Michigan as one of the selected cities to send a schoolboy representative to the 21st AAA national safety patrol convention in Washington, D. C., May 4 to 8.

The Birmingham delegate, to be selected from safety patrol ranks in the next two weeks, will not necessarily be 100 other Michigan patrolers in Detroit, May 2, for a four-day all-expense trip to the nation's capital as the guest of Auto club.

The Birmingham school, judged by Auto club to have the most effective overall safety program, will be invited to name its outstanding patrol boy as the city's official delegate.
