FRANKLIN — When the Red Cross Inter-Lakes bloodmobile comes to the Franklin Community church April 8 they hope to obtain at least 100 pints of blood to replenish the blood bank which is running low. In fact, at this point Franklin has only 19 to its credit.

ANYONE living in the blood bank area is entitled to free blood transfusions and is not obligated to see that it is replaced. Hospitals do make a small charge for administering this free Red Cross blood.

"Often blood is needed quickly and the hospital will not make arrangements with the Red Cross in advance. In that case blood is bought from the hospital, at considerable expense," Mrs. Cole explained.
