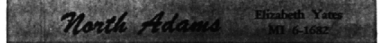

Girl Scouting—Family Affair—Yes, Men, Too!

Girl Scouts in this area, along with scouts across the nation will be celebrating Girl Scout Week starting Sunday. Marking the anniversary of the founding of Girl Scouts of the U. S. A., the annual celebration always include March 12, the day in 1912 when Juliette Gordon Low called together the little group of 12 girls in Savannah, Ga., who voted to set up the first girl scout troop.

National membership now totals 2,190,000 girls and 670,000 women and men. Southern Oakland Girl Scout Council includes 11,562 girls and 4,088 adult members.

THESE DAYS, when you talk about Girl Scouts, you have to specify whether you mean girl Girl Scouts, lady Girl Scouts or men Girl Scouts, because there very definitely are such things. Men are Girl Scout council presidents, program consultants, fund raisers and let's face it, men are Girl Scouts. Apparently it's been true of the Girl Scouts for a long time now.
