MSU Education Survey Being Distributed

Residents of the Birmingham 1000 questionnaires in the two counties began early this week. The project is being conducted by Michigan State University to determine the needs for post-high school education in Oakland and Macomb counties. Questionnaires will be given to many high school students and also will reach many of the area homes during the next week. Distribution of more than 100,

and to the parents of children in the 2nd, 10th and 12th grades. All teachers and school administrators also will be included. Information sought by this method will help M.S.U. plan its projected branch at the Meadowbrook Farm estate near Pontiac and also will help junior college committees in the two counties. Questionnaires were delivered Monday, to the office of the county superintendent of schools for distribution to the many local schools. THE PROJECT previously had been explained to and endorsed by the various Macomb and Oakland county organizations of superintendents and principals. "Other adults in the area will be brought into the project later this summer," reports Dr. Hopper. Questionnaires will be circulated later to civic-service clubs, management and labor groups, women's organizations and other representative group.

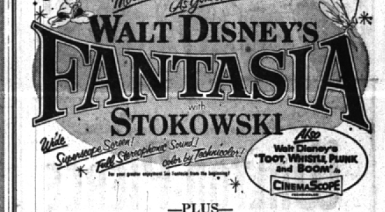

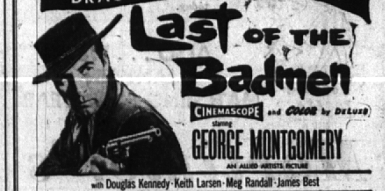
