Cover 32,000 Miles on Three-Month Trip

Entertain British Couple On Return to Birmingham

After having basked in the warm hospitality of people of many nations during a recent 32,000-mile trip, Mr. and Mrs. Hugh Hemphill of Mayfair lane, Southfield township, provided a bit of the same last weekend to Mr. and Mrs. J. C. Chippendale of Cheshire, England.

The two couples met on the S. S. Mariposa as it wended its way across the Pacific. The Hemphills on the homeward lap of a trip to Australia, and the

After docking in San Francisco on the seventh of May, the Hemphills departed for Birmingham. The English couple toured the States, ending their visit with a brief stay in Birmingham, early this week, before leaving for Montreal for England.

THE HEMPHILLS, whose comments on returning were like most vacationers', "There's no place like home," departed from Birmingham on February 5, leaving the snow behind as they traveled by train to California.

Boarding the cargo ship Elizabeth Bakko at San Francisco, on February 9, they put in at Manila on the 28th for their first sight-seeing jaunt of the trip. A fat tire during their tour of the city turned out to be a happy experience, as a young woman stepped out of a lovely home nearby and invited the five tourists to relax on a beautifully cool patio while the driver made the tire change. They soon discovered that their hosts and her husband were Americans, she a graduate of the University of Michigan, and a former Grosse Pointe resident.

SECOND STOP on the journey was Hongkong, where their stay was so enjoyable, they decided to

plan another trip in four weeks, concentrating on Kiangkong and Japan. Mrs. Hemphill wrote home, "Hongkong, now there is a place none of you, if you can spare the time, should miss. It is indeed a fabulous city. The ship anchors in the harbor and we are met with sampans and junks on which the native people live the year round and conduct their business. The junks unload our cargo. Here the women do far more of the work than the men, often with babies strapped to their backs. There is a cleanliness here, there is happiness and smiling faces despite the fact they work hard and live on junks or in shacks. . . Beautiful Chinese girls everywhere with their silk skirts almost to their hips, and pretty legs, too. Shopping is out of this world. . . I was measured for two suits at 11 a.m. on a Monday, had one fitting that evening, and picked them up the following evening at 7 p.m."

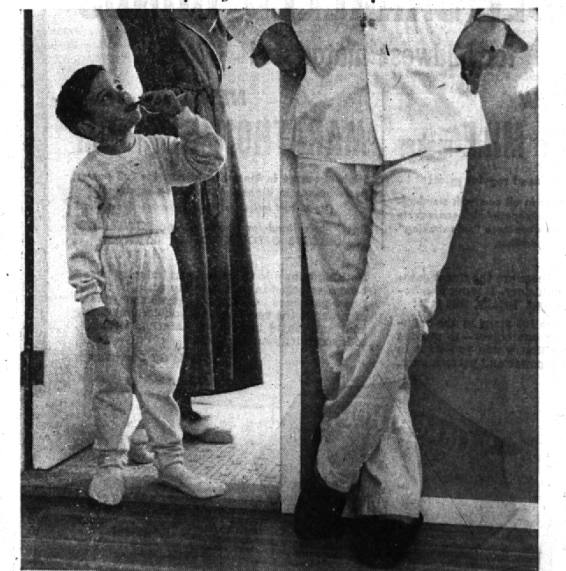
