Parties Original

With graduation time just around the corner for many teenagers who will be wanting to entertain and have the whole class, I offer the suggestion of a Progressive Games Party.

It works the same as a progressive dinner party except, instead of getting part of a meal at each home, there is a game set up in each house and the players go from home to home in pursuit of playing them all and finishing first and with the most points collected.

THE HOSTESS should send out written, individual, invitations to this party stating that they are to meet at her house at a certain hour. Upon their arrival, she will put them off in couples or four-somes.

A good way to do this might be to have the score cards for the evening prepared and each bearing a different title of a hit tune of the day.

Then, she would give to the boys, a pencil with a tag tied to it bearing the name of the star singer of the tune which she gave to the girls. They match up song titles and singers for partners.

ON THE BACK of the score cards has been written the succession of homes to be visited in order. For instance, Bill Big's house No. 1, Nancy Little's house No. 2, etc. They should have to go to eight or ten homes. Some cards should begin with home number three, some with home number five and so on to avoid having the whole group trying to play the game in a certain house at the same time.

A GAME has been set up in each house and as soon as the players finish it, they progress to the next house until they have completed them all. Finally they return to the home of the hostess for tallying of the scores, presentation of prizes and a midnite hot dog barbecue in the yard with plenty of soft drinks and potato chips.

Suggested games might be table or floor shuffleboard, chinese checkers, ring-toss, indoor quarts, carroms, a small jig-saw puzzle and cooties.

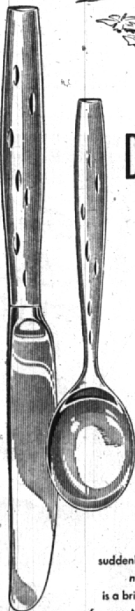
