S'field High School Head To Quit Post
 The annual Gray-Y overnite at Camp Obyena will be held May 10 and 11 (Friday and Saturday). Boy and girl members 10 to 15 years old are eligible to attend. The "Y" bus will leave the building at 408 E. Lincoln at 4:15 p.m. Friday. We return Saturday at a p.m. \$6. per person, fee pays for three meals, insurance, housing, use of camp equipment and leadership. The first 35 boys and girls who pay the registration fee will be transported in the bus. Others will have to make their own arrangements for transportation. There will be seven boys or girls in a cabin. Gray-Y leaders and high school students will serve as leaders. George Ewing will act as camp director. Deadline for registration is Thursday, May 9.

Set Turner Hearing On Turner Request For Zone Change
 Recommendation of the Birmingham planning board to deny Harold Turner's petition to permit parking of new cars on three lots at Bowers and Elm streets was accepted Monday by the Birmingham city commission.

Commissioners set June 10 as the date for a public hearing on Attorney George Gram's reactivated petition for business B at the Elm-Bowers location. The board had recommended that a reasonable use of the property would be business C.

City Planner Herbert Herzberg outlined the board's plan to change zoning of the three lots east of Elm and fronting on Forest, Hazel and Chestnut, from single family and business A to multiple family, as a desirable fringe zoning.

Commissioners were advised by a meeting visitor that an electrical firm has already purchased the third business lot in from Elm on Forest.
