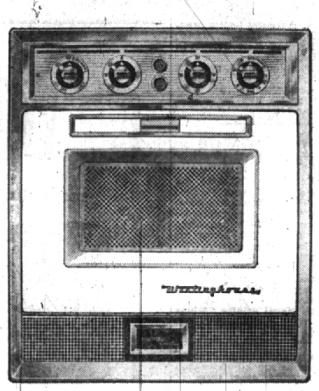
Two B'ham Girls Elected at Smith
