Blame U.S. Gov't For Gas Shortage

Federal regulation of natural gas field prices hampers efforts to obtain a larger supply of natural gas for outstate Michigan, according to Claude A. Mulligan, vice president of Consumers Power company.

Speaking last night at a regional meeting of Consumers stockholders in the Birmingham Community House, Mulligan said:

"There are adequate supplies of natural gas in the field, the South and the Southwest. More pipeline capacity is needed to bring this gas to Michigan. Why haven't the additional pipeline capacity been provided?"

IN OUR OPINION, the Federal regulation of the price of gas at the well-head, on top of the regulation of pipeline rates, has been a real deterrent to the increasing of pipeline capacities. It has made it more difficult for us to obtain additional supplies of gas.

"But the matter of contracting for enough gas to satisfy the needs of our customers is a problem that must be solved, and we intend to solve it."

Natural gas distributed by Consumers is brought to Michigan by the Panhandle Eastern Pipe Line company and much of it is stored in storage fields operated by Michigan Gas Storage company, a Consumers subsidiary.

CONSUMERS HAS been unable to connect additional space heating customers since space heating service was extended to 30,000 additional customers in late 1955 and early 1956. The company does not restrict sale of gas for other domestic purposes such as cooking and water heating.

Mulligan pointed out that nearly half of all Consumers gas customers are receiving space heating service and that the number of space heating customers has been increased more than 400% in the last eight years.

"REAL PROGRESS has been made in meeting this space heating problem," he said.

Stockholders viewed a documentary film illustrating the highlights of the year, including electric and gas construction projects in various parts of the state. One sequence showed ceremonies attending the start of construction of the new Enrico Fermi Atomic Power Plant near Monroe. Consumers is one of 26 electric and industrial companies cooperating in the Fermi project.
