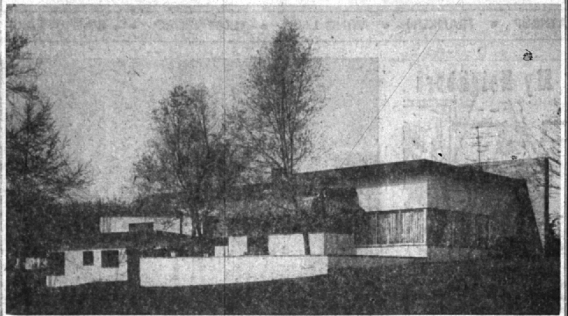
BLOOMFIELD—Township board last week appropriated \$200 to purchase badges, hats and armbands for Bloomfield township civil defense workers.

While at Pittsburgh, parties were given at two country clubs in their honor.

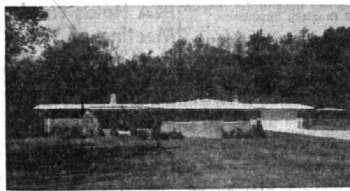
Dr. Ames To Speak
