MAY MARATHON

The race is on and the winner is yet unknown. It may be fungus; it may be bugs; it may be you. Here are a few tips to help you in the battle:—

1. Peonies require a lot of H₂O and often respond to a bit of fertilizer such as AGRICO 5-10-5 or STADLERS 4-12-4.
2. DON'T feel that because you dug in a little DRICONURE this spring that you have provided enough fertilizer for the plants' needs for the year. Driconure is a superb conditioner and starter. Follow up with 2 or 3 dressings of the material in time 1.
3. If you like lupine lice don't read this... If you don't like lupine lice spray or dust with ROTENONE.
4. PLANT DAHLIAS NOW! The colors we have left are red, yellow, red, pink, red, maroon, red, white and red.
5. Divide SHASTA DAISIES. Don't let new plants flower too freely the first year.
6. The delay in the arrival of buds on many tulips was due to something or other. However, all of ours now have beautiful flowers—at the right height, too.
7. As soon as hollyhocks start to grow spray them but good with BORDEAUX.
8. There is a lot of GIBBERISH going around town about the new GIBBERELLIC ACID which makes things (vegetative things by heaven) grow like 60. That's about all we know of it except that it makes things grow like 59 or 60.
9. POTATOES are a cinch if you can see the advantage of buying a few EYES to grow them from. We don't carry the whole potatoes any more... just boxes of EYES carefully packed in sawdust.

10. Look for lace bugs on rhododendron and azaleas especially if grown in full sun. They roast on the underside of leaves. Spray after flowers have faded.
 11. Allow tulip and daffodil leaves to die gracefully. Don't cut them off until brown... unless you are getting rid of them.
 12. Spray or dust roses regularly with ORTHO ROSE DUST or TRIOLON.

14. The nasty orange colored gelatinous material appearing on cedars and some junipers is probably CEDAR APPLE RUST.
Spray the apples or flowering crabs with MIKE SULPHUR 4 to 6 times in the next 4 months.
Spray the cedars or junipers with MIKE SULPHUR early in July and again early in August.
15. Rabbits hate the sight of blood... ergo, put some BLOOD MEAL around the flower which you do not want the rabbits to partake of.
